# CLASS Action

## Class of 1967 Reaches the Half-Century Mark



2017 was a milestone year for MHS Class of '67, celebrating 50 years. Led by Bobbie Arita and Lloyd Inouye, the Reunion Committee started planning over a year in advance. All the hours of hard work paid off big time.

In preparation for the event, the Class held a Portuguese Sausage fundraiser, which helped with some of the Reunion expenses. Also, with donations from classmates, they were able to make a gift to the MHS Foundation in the amount of \$2467, exceeding their goal of \$1967. Another \$300 gift was earmarked for the ACOM program, whose students helped produce the Reunion slideshow. At the beginning of the 2016 academic year (50 years after the start of their Senior year), a \$1000 gift to the Foundation was made to benefit the athletic program.

Joining those in Hawaii for the Reunion were classmates from Washington, Oregon, Nevada, and Georgia, some for the first time. The first night was at Heritage Hall in Paia, where activities were full of rollicking good fun and games, prizes, and laughs galore. Laughs and prizes continued into the second night at Maui Beach Hotel, which also featured a candlelight memorial service for their deceased classmates, who remain part of their '67 family still. Each night concluded with heartfelt singing of the Alma Mater. It's been 50 years, and this class still rocks!

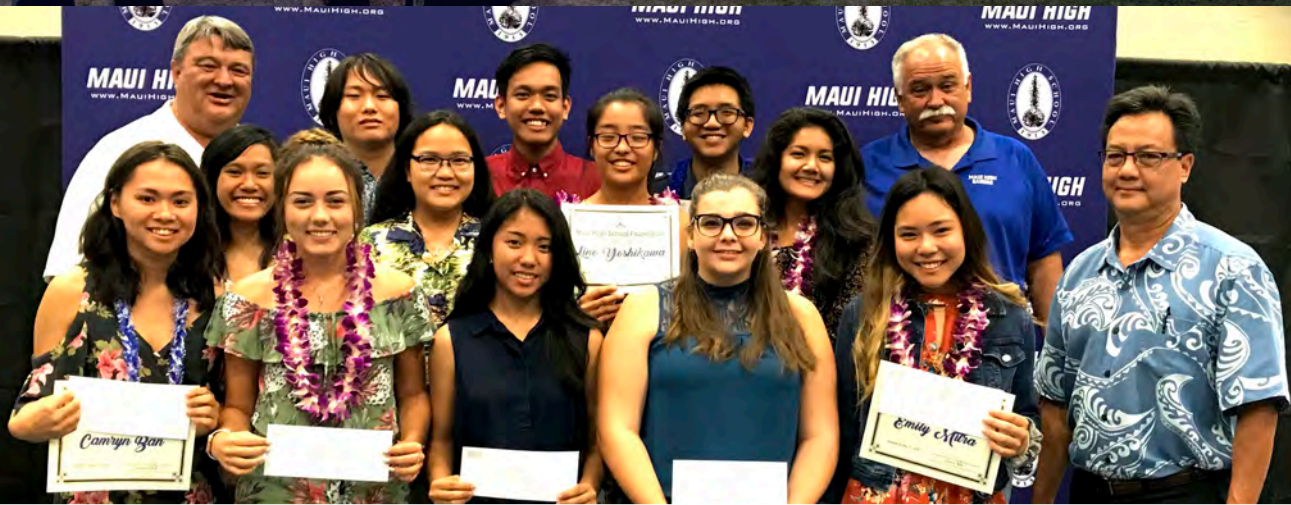

## Academic Competition Highlights

### MATH



Maui High's Math Team topped local Math League competition. In regular season the team won 4 out of 5 meets. The Foundation was pleased to send members of the Math team to compete in statewide Math Bowl competition on Oahu where they placed 5th in their division.

### SCIENCE



In February, Maui High's Ocean Sciences Bowl team won the 2018 Aloha Bowl at the University of Hawaii, Manoa. The regional event consisted of 10 teams from throughout Hawaii's public and private schools. This win gave Maui High its 7th state title in the Ocean Sciences competition.

### HISTORY



Six Maui High students advanced through district and state History Day events and qualified to participate in the 2018 National History Day competition in Washington DC. With community support the Foundation was able to award \$4275 to help offset the group's travel and registration expenses.





## Gym Named to Honor Shine



On Thursday, December 14, 2017 Maui High School held a special naming ceremony for the its gym. The facility, now named the Izumi “Shine” Matsui Athletic Complex, honors the late Izumi “Shine” Matsui who served Maui High School as a teacher, coach, and Athletic Director over a span of nearly 30 years. Shine joined Maui High’s faculty in 1959 as a teacher and coach while the school was still located in Hamakuapoko. Under Shine, Maui High Athletics experienced growth in its programs and facilities, development of girls sport teams, and formation of co-educational PE classes. He was at the helm of the Athletic Department during several program milestones such as the school’s relocation to the Kahului Campus in 1972, the implementation of Title IX policies around that same time, as well as the construction of the gymnasium in 1979. Shine was inducted into Maui High’s Hall of Honor in 2014 with the Inspiration Award. Shine touched and inspired many lives during his time at MHS.

## The Spirit Lives On

*Mural Completed*

On Wednesday, May 9, 2018, Maui High School and the Foundation held an unveiling ceremony for its new mural of Maui High’s original campus at Hamakuapoko. Bearing the title “The Spirit Lives On”, a slogan that has been popularized among alumni of the H’Poko campus over the years, Sabado’s original watercolor commemorates the iconic arches and campus life at old MHS. An enlarged, two piece embellished giclee of the original painting is now placed in the gym foyer for all to enjoy. The project was funded in large part by MHS alumnus, Mr. Donald Takaki, class of 1959.

# Maui High Makes Progress In College & Career Readiness

In April, the Hawaii Department of Education reported on Maui High School's growing success in preparing students to be college and career ready. Below is an excerpt from the article, "College & Career Readiness Strengthens at Maui High".

About five years ago, Maui High restructured to become a college and career readiness hub. Of course that's an aim for any high school, but in Maui High's case, the journey involved these specific steps:

- CTE focused, with freshmen taking two courses to begin learning hard and soft skills aligned to careers
- A full-time college and career counselor in addition to grade-level counselors
- Strengthening connections to the Educational Opportunities Center, a federal program to help disadvantaged students go to college that's housed at UH-Maui College
- Open enrollment for Advanced Placement courses
- Strong growth in the Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID) program to prepare students for college with skills and success mindsets (see video, above)
- Greater communication around the value and benefits of the honors diploma
- Making Senior Projects mandatory for graduation. These student passion projects begin with planning during the junior year and culminate in a research paper, a project or product, a portfolio, and a presentation to a panel of adult judges delivered in the senior year.

Along the way, the culture at Maui High became one of encouragement with taking chances — that students should feel confident to try or do something they may not have seen in themselves academically or creatively.

The results of this school-wide effort are reflected in the latest College & Career Readiness Indicators report, an annual look at how Hawai'i's public high schools are doing to prepare students for post-secondary life.

For Maui High's Class of 2017, nearly one in three graduates earned an honors diploma. Sixty percent of students went to college (five points above the state average), and among those who went the year prior, 82 percent were still in college (four points above the state average).

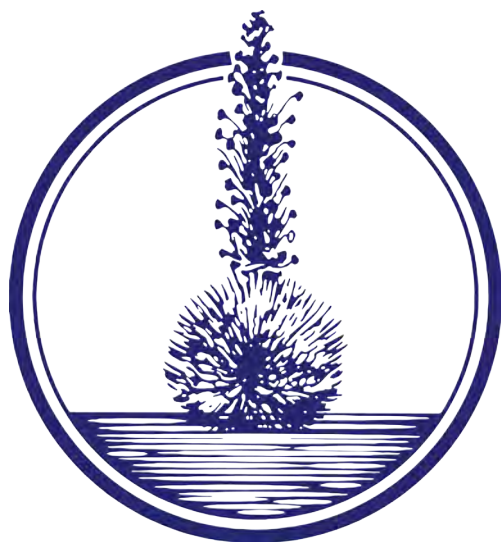
